Brief Synopsis: My PhD research sought to establish that for Jean Rhys the Self was a fundamentally fragmented entity. Using Rhys's five novels as core texts, it argued that Rhys's concern in her novels had been fragmentation of the Self. Drawing on Jacques Lacan's theory of subject formation, it proposed that an understanding of Rhys's engagement with the fragmentation of the Self was crucial to understanding her texts. My research combined close reading of Rhys's texts with Lacan's findings on subject formation through the Mirror stage and the subject's encounter with language. It focused on Rhys's consistent use of the trope of mirror in her longer fiction to analyse the fragmented selves of her heroines. It further elaborated the theme of fragmentation of the Self with reference to her heroines' engagement with language. This research suggested that in Rhys's vision unification of the Self was an elusive concept.
